

A medicinal plant garden has been developed at the institute campus named 'Sanjeevani'. The garden maintains a live collection of over 40 species of different medicinal and aromatic plants which contains herbs, shrubs, and trees. The plants grown are used for demonstration and practical purposes in the Pharmacognosy and Phytochemistry course. This also imparts a value addition in the herbal drug research for the UG and PG students. It supplies crude material as well as fresh plant specimens for experimentation and research in herbal medicines.


